Co-curricular Transcript

The Co-Curricular Transcript (CCT) is a record of your educational workshops and programs, leadership activities, participation in student government and organizations, community service, and scholarships and awards.

The Co-Curricular Transcript is divided into six sections: (Examples provided)

- A. **LEADERSHIP ACTIVITIES:** Includes positions of leadership within a club or organization (Captain, President, and Vice-President).
- B. **PROFESSIONAL AND EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT:** Includes on-campus work experience.
- C. **HONORS, AWARDS, SCHOLARSHIPS & RECOGNITION:** Any formal recognition of academic or scholarly success.
- D. **STUDENT GOVERNMENT AND ORGANIZATIONS:** Includes membership in any group on campus or participation in an extracurricular activity.
- E. **COMMUNITY SERVICE:** (American Red Cross, Auxiliary Police Department, etc.).
- F. **CLUES:** Includes any CLUE certified activity on campus that you have completed and signed the attendance form.

Students should fill out a validation form, which will help track accomplishments. Forms are available at <http://www.csi.cuny.edu/CLUE/cocurr.html>.

The CCT Process

1. **Start:** Start your CCT. Each student will need to complete the Co-Curricular Transcript Entry and Validation Form including contact information.
2. **Decide:** Decide what types of CCT entries will represent you best when your transcript is complete.
3. **Fill Out:** Fill out the entries completely on the Co-Curricular Transcript Entry and Validation Form.
4. **Validate:** Validate each Co-Curricular Transcript Entry Form record by having your organization supervisor, organization advisor, CSI staff member, or CSI faculty member to sign the bottom of the form. Please check with the Office of New Student Orientation if you are unsure who is qualified to verify your record.
5. **Submit:** Submit your Co-Curricular Transcript Entry and Validation Form to the Office of New Student Orientation. Do not forget to update your record of your extracurricular activities on and off campus each semester in order to keep your Co-Curricular transcript current.
