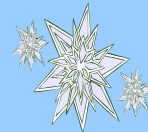

Skin Deep & What's Race Got to Do with It?

Two films are available for CLUE credit. *Skin Deep* is a film that was produced in response to the growing wave of racial hatred and violence in this country.
