COURSE TITLE: History of Ukraine

HOURS: 4

CATALOG DESCRIPTION: The history of Ukraine from its earliest to most recent times, with an emphasis on political, religious, social and intellectual aspects. This course covers relations with Russia and other countries, tracing formation and growth of the Ukrainian national identity and previous attempts at state-building. Particular attention will be given to the transformation of Ukraine into the modern nation which declared its independence in 1991, endured three revolutions and has defended its political and cultural security despite invasion by Russia. The class will discuss how Ukraine appears on the political and cultural map of Europe, as well as comprehending the historical background of the Ukrainian struggle for its independence and national security. For History majors and minors, this is designated as a Modern European history course.

LIBERAL ARTS AND SCIENCES (YES OR NO): Yes

GENERAL EDUCATION: Social Science Contemporary World

If a course is being considered to satisfy general education requirements, the proposal will need the approval of both the UCC and the GEC before moving on to FS.

EFFECTIVE: SPRING (TOPICS ONLY)

ROLE IN CURRICULUM: The course will serve as a 200-level course in History that would be available as a General Education course for students in any major with minimal prerequisites. It will satisfy the 200-level requirement for the History Major and the Minor (History majors are required to complete a course in Modern European history). For History majors and minors, this is designated as a Modern European History course.

RATIONALE At present there is no Ukrainian history course at CSI, although there are several 200- and 300-level Russian history courses. This course makes a significant contribution to understanding the history of Ukraine and the entire region including Russia. It will help students comprehend the decolonization process in the Ukrainian-Russian relationship and provide a historical background to the contemporary Russian-Ukrainian war. This course will be offered every other academic calendar year and as needed. This course will be added to the list of existing courses. As there is an expectation of significant developmental writing at the 200 level, a course cap of 35 is appropriate.
